The conference has been organised by a group of people from various institutes and organisations involved in religious education and pastoral ministry in Ireland.

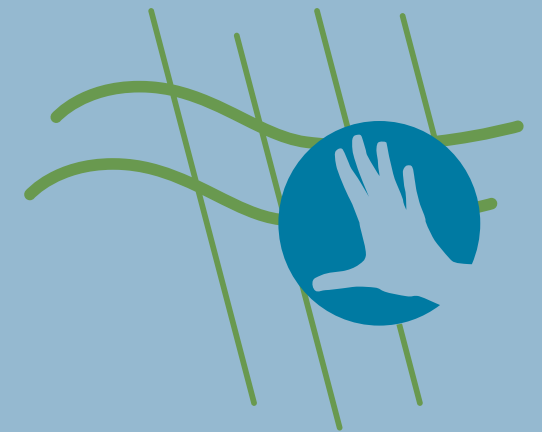
